What is the Internship and Training Program?

It is a 9 week internship with the PARTNRS research team. You will learn about public health research and gain hands-on research experience. You will work with research assistants and scientists every day to help interview young couples that are having a baby.

What is PARTNRS?

PARTNRS is a public health research study through Yale University for young couples having a baby in Connecticut. The goal is to see what life is like for young couples as they become parents. PARTNRS will build programs to help strengthen families in our communities and prevent the spread of HIV and STDs.

What will I do in the internship and training program?

You will learn:

- how public health research works by shadowing researchers and going to workshops.
- how to recruit and interview research participants.
- skills in excel, powerpoint, presentations, resume writing, etc.

You will:

- recruit and interview young adults having a baby or who have just had a baby.
- work with experienced research assistants to manage study files and data.
- attend workshops to gain skills and knowledge.

Will I get paid?

Yes! Interns in high school will earn up to \$2,700 over 6-9 weeks (\$8/hour).

Interns in college, trade school, etc. will earn up to \$3,375 over 6-9 weeks (\$10/hour).

Who can apply?

Students interested in science or health careers are encouraged to apply!

You can apply if you are 16 or older and live in or around New Haven, CT. You also have to be:

- a student in high school OR
- a student finishing high school this spring 2010 OR
- a student in college, trade school or other educational program.

What are the hours?

You will work M-F from 9am to 5pm at our office in downtown New Haven. The internship will start in June and end in August.
